JEAN TALBOT



Jean Talbot's early life was peripatetic: her father, as a founder member of the Royal Air Force and senior officer, had various postings far and wide. However, after the Second World War, her family settled at Church Farm House, Chilbolton from where in 1951, she was married to Squadron leader Ian Bourne.

He had been a young spitfire pilot during the war, shot down and imprisoned in Stalag Luft 3. After the births of Jeremy and Ian and the tragic death of her husband in a flying accident over the North Sea, Jean bought a house in Itchen Abbas where she and her young family lived until 1967.

In 1959 she married James Talbot who lived at Church Farm House, Barton Stacey with his mother Helen. Helen had lived here since she and her husband John retired from the headmastership of Haileybury School in 1932. On Helen's death in 1966, James and Jean came to live in Barton Stacey with their burgeoning family now increased by Fuzzy, Olivia and Sophia.

Jean has been a tireless member of the Barton Stacey community, a regular attendant at All Saints' Church and a generous hostess at her lovely house. She initiated the Barbecue Swim, an annual mid-summer event at Church Farm House raising money for the church. At Christmas, she has hosted the popular Christmas Carol Suppers for several years, also boosting church funds. For many people in the village, this event heralds the beginning of Christmas festivities.

All her life Jean has been an animal lover. Her children were brought up with dogs and animals and for many years Jean, Olivia and Sophia were keen members of the local Pony Club. In the early years, Jean was regularly seen

driving her pony trap on the roads around Barton Stacey and many villagers will remember the sight. She has been an enthusiastic supporter of local businesses and charitable causes. For years she was an active member of the Hampshire Boys' Club Committee.

After James retired from his successful city career, she opened Church Farm House as a member of Wolsey Lodges, welcoming strangers and old friends to stay at Church Farm House, looking after them with her customary hospitality and friendliness and developing a national and international reputation.

Now she is a devoted grandmother to her seven grandchildren, all regular visitors to Church Farm House and she follows their progress proudly. Not as physically active as hitherto, she nevertheless retains a keen interest in local affairs and people who will remember her legendary kindness and generosity. For many years now the annual Church Fête has been held at Church Farm House and it gives her huge pleasure to welcome the village.

The Right Revd David Williams

The Right Revd David Williams (aged 54) studied Social Policy at Bristol University and after some years working with CMS in Kenya, trained for the ordained ministry at Wycliffe Hall, Oxford. He served his curacy in the Diocese of Sheffield at All Saints, Ecclesall from 1989 to 1992 after which he became Vicar of Dore, an adjacent parish. He was made Rural Dean of Ecclesall in 1997 and served in this role until moving South in 2002. During these years he was also a Chaplain at Aldine House Secure Children's Home.

Moving to the Diocese of Winchester in 2002, he became Vicar of Christ Church Winchester and was made an Honorary Canon of Winchester Cathedral in 2012. He was elected to General Synod in 2010 and became Chair of the House of Clergy of Winchester Diocesan Synod in 2012.

David grew up in Uganda and retains strong links with East Africa. He is married to Helen and they have 2 children, Sarah (25) and Mark (22). David owns a small racing yacht and spends days off sailing in the Solent. Together with his son, Mark, he also completed 2 long motorbike journeys across Eastern and Central Africa in 2010 and 2012.
